In accordance with Title II Section 251 of HAVA the State of Georgia expended the following Title II funds in compliance with Title II and Title III requirements in accordance with the State HAVA Plan submitted to the Election Assistance Commission and published in the Federal Register in July 2003.

Title II Section 251 Voting System Replacement. \$4,262,935.58

A. DRE Voting Equipment. Sec 251(b)(1) and Sec 301(a).

The State of Georgia acquired an additional 955 DRE voting units for distribution to each of the 159 counties prior to the November 2004 General Election. This supplemental acquisition improved the ratio of voting units per voter and also provided counties with an additional voting unit for use in the absentee voting precincts for in-person absentee voting.

B. DRE Voting Equipment. Sec 251(b)(1) and Sec 301(a).

The State of Georgia acquired additional voting system components, i.e., computer servers used to prepare ExpressPoll units for Election Day operations; flash card duplicators for preparing ExpressPoll units for Election Day operations; and a warranty extension for the statewide uniform voting system.

Title II Section 251 Matching Funds Expenditures: \$2,865,571.00

Pursuant to Title II Section 253(b)(5) of HAVA the State of Georgia expended the following funds towards the 5% match as required by the above referenced HAVA section and in accordance with the State HAVA Plan.

A. Statewide Uniform Electronic Voting Expenditures.

The State of Georgia continued its voter education and outreach programs designed to ensure the voters' familiarity and comfort level with use of the voting system. The state continued its efforts in education and voting system training for county election officials. The State continued its support to the Center for Election Systems at Kennesaw State University regarding procedural and security enhancements to safeguard the conduct of elections in the State of Georgia. The State continued its support of the ballot building program offered by the Center for Election Systems and continued providing instructional materials and election related supplies to all 159 counties.

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B. Statewide Centralized Voter Registration System.

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The State continued its maintenance and support of the statewide-centralized voter registration database. These efforts include mainframe connectivity to the counties, increased security monitoring, maintenance charges, system upgrades, and system support provided by the Georgia Technology Authority.

Funds were also used to cover banking expenses associated with maintaining the separate HAVA bank account.
