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2004 HAVA EXPENDITURES

Statewide Voter Registration System (SVRS) - \$199,130.00

The State determined it was necessary to retain a private vendor to develop and build the SVRS to meet all the HAVA requirements. In that regard, the State retained the services of Virchow Krause, a consulting firm, to assist the State in the vendor selection process. Virchow Krause was chosen because of its experience in assisting other states in their SVRS implementation. Virchow Krause assisted in the preparation of the Request for Procurement (RFP) materials and oversaw the bidding and selection process.

Voter Education and Training - \$1,417,545.15

One of the main goals of HAVA is to encourage voter participation. In furtherance of this mandate, the New Jersey "Be Powerful, Be Heard" Voter Outreach and Education Initiative was created to inform New Jersey citizens of HAVA-related electoral procedures and to emphasize the importance of registering and voting. Beginning in 2004 the Office of the Attorney General produced a number of public service announcements that were broadcast on television and radio as well as the Internet. These announcements informed the public of upcoming elections and related-electoral deadlines and at all times were non-partisan.

The State also recognized the importance of educating students on governmental and electoral issues. Accordingly, in September 2004, the State of New Jersey held the first hip-hop summit, which was attended by approximately 2,000 college and high school students throughout the State. It was an educational event. The summit was a panel discussion of electoral and civic matters. The event included voter registration opportunities for the attendees. The panelists included celebrities as well as elected officials and State officials.

Support Staff - Administrative Costs - \$10,244.88

Personnel who were assigned to HAVA implementation tasks attended various conferences and functions for educational purposes. These travel expenses are reflected in the attached itemized list of expenditures for 2004.
