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III. Voting Equipment

The Office of the Secretary of State did not purchase any additional voting equipment with Title II funds during the period October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005. The Office of the Secretary of State did spend \$787.67 on legal fees for researching available accessible voting equipment.

The State Board of Elections did not spend any Title II funding for accessible voting equipment during this period.

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IV. Analysis and Description

ACTIVITIES FUNDED BY THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE TO MEET HAVA REQUIREMENTS AND HOW SUCH ACTIVITIES CONFORM TO THE SUBMITTED STATE PLAN

During the period October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005, the Office of the Secretary of State spent Title II monies in the following areas (1) equipment that meets voting system standards; (2) provisional ballots; (3) voting information; and (4) the statewide central voter registration system (CVRS).

1. EQUIPMENT THAT MEETS VOTING SYSTEM STANDARDS.

The Office of the Secretary of State conducted its legal review of accessible voting equipment available to the state with consideration given to the current optical scan precinct count system and state and federal mandates. The Office of the Secretary of State began the purchase process for the AutoMark system to be available in 2006 as per HAVA mandates.

2. PROVISIONAL BALLOTS

While the State Board of Elections has jurisdiction over the rules and regulations for provisional balloting in Rhode Island, the Office of the Secretary of State has the responsibility for the printing of provisional ballots. The Office of the Secretary of State prepared and printed provisional ballots for the 2004 elections.

3. VOTING INFORMATION

The Office of the Secretary of State worked with legal counsel to review voting information provided by the office in light of the mandates of HAVA.

4. STATEWIDE VOTER REGISTRATION LISTS

In 2004 the Office of the Secretary of State installed their Central Voter Registration System (CVRS) in all 39 cities and towns in Rhode Island. State law requires that the Office of the Secretary of State provide all hardware, software, maintenance and support to the 39 cities and towns as necessary for the operation of the CVRS.

During this reporting period, the Office of the Secretary of State maintained the CVRS application and hardware as well as the closed network for the system. This office also trained all local users on the application and served as the help desk and support team for the 39 cities and towns. Maintenance of local street files for the input of data into the CVRS was also provided to the municipalities during this period. Additional voter letters and notices produced by CVRS were also translated into Spanish.

As the agency responsible for the CVRS, the Office of the Secretary of State also made payments for all necessary application and network licensing and fees.

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IV. Analysis and Description

*ACTIVITIES FUNDED BY THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS TO MEET
HAVA REQUIREMENTS AND HOW SUCH ACTIVITIES CONFORM TO THE
SUBMITTED STATE PLAN*

During the period October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005, the State Board of Elections spent Title II monies in the following areas (1) provisional ballots and (2) voting information.

1. PROVISIONAL BALLOTS

While the Office of the Secretary of State is responsible for printing provisional ballots, the State Board of Elections has jurisdiction over the conduct of voting on Election Day. The Board of Elections spent Title II funds for the legal review of the rules and regulations associated with provisional voting. Additionally, funds were spent for the purchase of transportation containers and security supplies associated with provisional ballots. Instructions and posters were prepared and printed by the State Board in English and Spanish.

2. VOTING INFORMATION

The State Board of Elections reviewed with legal counsel and provided voting information as required by HAVA for poll workers for training in the new provisional ballot program.

Revised voter information was also printed in English and Spanish.
